

Yellow-Legged Asian Hornet identification

Think you've spotted a Yellow-Legged Asian hornet? Take a look at the images below and let us know which one resembles the insect you have seen.



Large, furry body, black and yellow/orange bands, short wings.



Shiny, black and yellow bands on abdomen, long antennae.



Shiny, variable striped markings, some dark with narrow yellow bands.



Dark brown head, brown/dark orange and black bands on abdomen, slightly furry.



Black and yellow, big eyes, wide body, tiny antennae, hovers in flight.



Large, elongated body, yellow and black-abdomen, long ovipositor, long yellow antennae.



Large dark brown eyes, black/brown bands on abdomen, loud buzzing in flight, small antennae.



Larger than a wasp, yellow and brown abdomen, yellow and brown head, brown/dark red legs.



Dark black/brown body, broad orange/yellow stripe near tail, yellow-tipped legs.
